IMPLICIT Network PDSA Challenge: PHQ9 Rates:

CONGRATULATIONS to the **University of Alabama** for the greatest percent increase in PHQ9 documentation rates for a positive PHQ2- 22.62%! Also, congratulations to **New Hanover** for a percent increase of 18.20%!

In an effort to increase PHQ9 documentation rates, the Network started a PHQ9 PDSA challenge. The challenge ran from July 1, 2018- November 2, 2018. Monthly updates were sent on the 30th of each month. Final numbers were calculated on November 2, 2018.

IMPLICIT Network PDSA Challenge: 5 Direct Observations

As discussed at the IMPLICIT Fall 2018 meetings, the Network's next PDSA cycle will focus on improving site workflows by observing 5 ICC eligible well child visits (WCVs). Provider champions will be expected to shadow 5 WCVs (resident, faculty, other) and document observations in REDCap or using the paper version of the form [PDSA cycle: 5 direct observations](#). After observing the WCVs, sites should use observations to update or reeducate providers on site workflows and appropriate documentation.

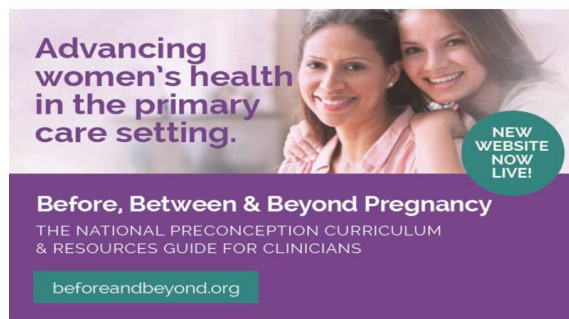

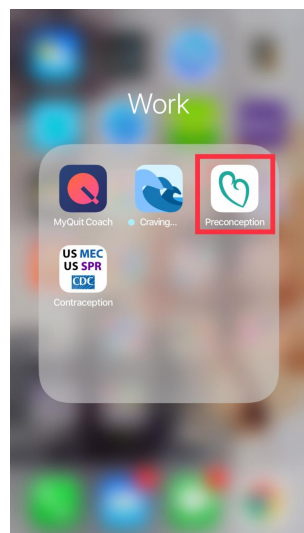


Preconception App:
